Strengthening Domestic Revenue Mobilisation (DRM)

- The toolkit is a critical tool for identifying tax collection gaps and designing evidence-based policies.
- It equips countries with tools to evaluate and address revenue losses effectively.
- It promotes transparency, accountability, and equity in tax systems.
